Brokens: Well made good liquoring types sold well at generally firm rates. Expensive lines were neglected. Medium and the plainer types were a good market and mostly sold at firm to occasionally slightly dearer rates.

Fannings: Best and the below best types sold readily at firm to occasionally slightly dearer rates. Others sold well at generally around last levels.

Dust: Clean good liquoring sorts met with a fairly strong demand and sold at firm to dearer rates of Tk. 5/7. Others sold well at around last levels. Poor end season types were neglected.

Comment: There was sustained demand for the well made good liquoring types which sold well at around last rates. Higher valued sorts were neglected. Mediums sold well whilst teas from the Northern District were also well supported. Poor and the end season varieties mostly remained unsold.
